



## Remote learning at Wingfield

Our approach to remote learning ensures that every child who is at home has access to the full curriculum that they would learn if they were in school. Carefully planned learning sequences and resources, created appropriately and accessibly for our Showbie platform, allow children to build on and develop their prior knowledge.

We take a blended approach to our teaching and lessons will be delivered in a number of different ways. The first is through the development of a pre-recorded video or guided lesson using voice notes which enable children to access high quality teaching of curriculum concepts, with plenty of opportunities for children to pause their lessons to apply learning before receiving feedback. The second way in which lessons are developed is through the teacher conducting the lesson live at a specified time of the day. The third is through the use of high-quality lessons and activities offered on platforms such as the Oak National Academy and BBC Bitesize. Children will receive specific and supportive feedback on the Showbie platform.

Children will have a daily live registration period as a way of motivating and engaging them in their learning for the day, and to enable them to communicate with their peers. These offer the opportunity for the teacher to set out learning for the day and for the class to see their peers, ask any further questions about their learning and understand how the remote school day is going to work.

With this document you will find your child's timetable. We have tried, where possible, to ensure that this mirrors what takes place in school. The lessons provide opportunities for direct teaching and modelling, and opportunities for the children to undertake independent tasks and practice the skills they have been taught.

Children in Nursery and Reception will have a weekly story time lesson with their class teacher to be held on Friday.

Top tips to support remote learning:

- Set a schedule and make it work for you. Whilst we have provided an example timetable, where possible take the time to make it work for you and your family;
- Ensure children log in and attend the registration/welcome sessions as these will provide them with a structure that engages them for the day;
- Ensure you have any resources you may need for the learning;
- Whilst we understand it is difficult in a busy family home, where possible ensure the environment is conducive to learning;
- Don't be tempted to do it for them! Help them to understand and let them submit their errors so that so that the teacher can pick up and address the key misconceptions in the next lesson;
- Encourage a growth mindset, praise effort and encourage perseverance;
- Keep the communication between home and school going;
- Ensure your child has regular rest breaks away from the screen;
- Don't let remote learning stop you doing the usual fun family things together.
